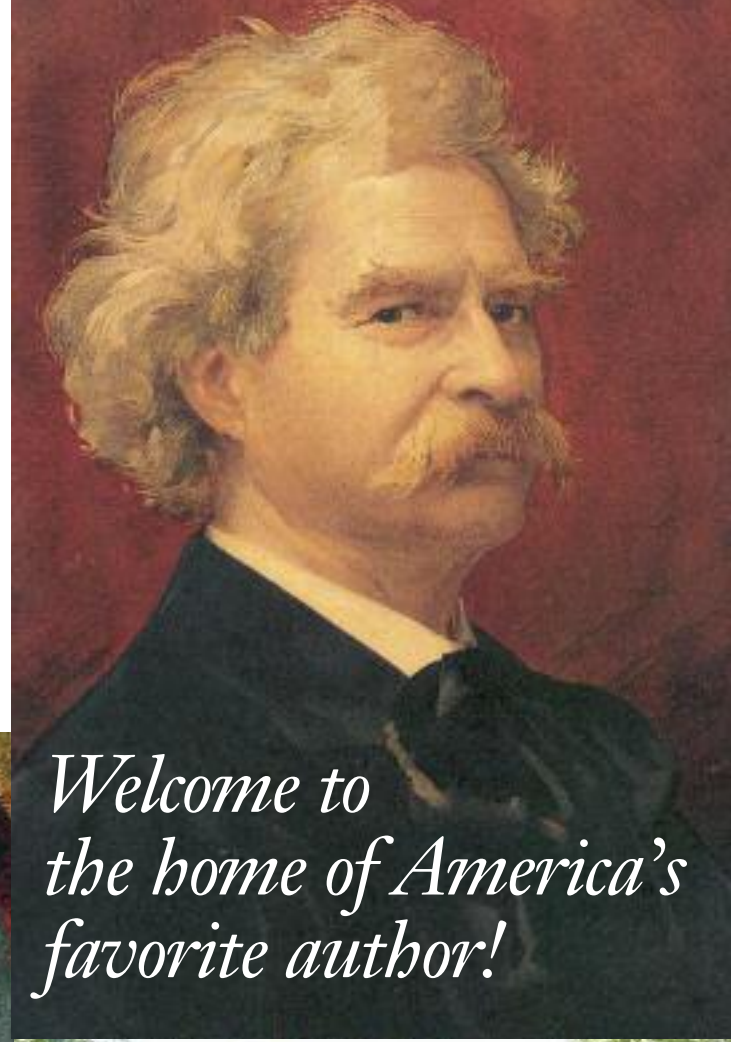

Twain worked on the adventures of Tom Sawyer and Huckleberry Finn. Explore the Servants' Wing, where a bustling staff kept up with the Clemens family's busy schedule.

In our Museum Center, wander our informative exhibitions, take in a Ken Burns documentary on Mark Twain, get lost in our treasure-filled Museum Store, or settle in for a leisurely lunch of American and Japanese favorites in our Murasaki Café.

Directions:

In Hartford, from I-84 East or West, take Exit 46, Sisson Avenue. At the traffic light, turn right onto Sisson Avenue. Continue four blocks to end and turn right onto Farmington Avenue. Look on the right for the sign marking the main museum entrance (before The Mark Twain House). Additional handicapped spaces available at 65 Forest Street (one block east past The Mark Twain House on the right). Set your GPS for 351 Farmington Avenue, Hartford, CT.

Closed: Jan 1, Easter Sunday, July 4, Nov 6, Thanksgiving Day, Dec 24 & 25
Free Parking. Fully air-conditioned. Museum Center is fully handicapped accessible. House: Handicapped accessible on first floor only. For the complete tour, visitors must be able to negotiate two flights of stairs. Murasaki Café is closed on Sunday except for special events.
